
2023 Year in Review

Cultivating meaningful relationships with our grant recipients and the diverse communities we proudly serve was a priority for Blue Foundry Charitable Foundation. The acquisition of Blackbaud Grantmaking database significantly bolstered our capacity to securely store, retrieve and analyze grantmaking data. This enhancement facilitated the Grant Committee in conducting thorough reviews of information sourced from online grant applications. Additionally, the introduction of grant reporting fostered communication and transparency in our interactions with grant recipients. A significant milestone was the successful execution of our inaugural volunteer event, where dedicated Blue Foundry Bank employees volunteered their time and efforts with the Great Swamp Watershed Association—a 2023 Gold Level Grant recipient. The Foundation proudly supported 66 non-profit organizations in New Jersey, channeling a total of \$416,651 in grants and donations to initiatives aligned with our mission, thereby fulfilling our requisite philanthropic commitments for the year.
